His Grace and Living Presence, with hearts of true conviction.


Re-gift His Love each moment, tell others of 'His Story.'

Conflict, Controversy & the Christian Life

Sanctification. Transformation. Great words. To me, they represent hope that I don't have to stay the way I am. Max Lucado wrote a book titled "Just Like Jesus." However, the cover of that book reads as follows: "God loves you just the way you are, but He refuses to leave you that way. He wants you to be Just Like Jesus." How true! Most of us came to Christ because we realized that our selfish, self centered choices brought misery to us and our loved ones. We wanted something more. We wanted this abundant life that Jesus promised. So begins the transformation process. We are shocked to learn that the trials and tribulation of life are God's fundamental tools to make us "Just Like Jesus." I have grown significantly through the most difficult agonizing experiences of my life.

The reason that I chose the headline for this article is because as I have prayed recently for God to destroy the fear of man in my life so that I



will be more concerned with what God thinks and less concerned with what man thinks of me. God is answering that prayer but in a very intense way. Lately, I have experienced several uncomfortable conflicts (mostly with believers). I am not saying that I was the innocent party in each of these scenarios. Each of these conflicts came

suddenly, without warning and they all had something in common. The individuals all challenged me in areas of deep personal convictions. I didn't like it and wanted to defend myself. Okay here is the point. If I can't handle confrontation from within (friendly fire from fellow believers) how in the world will I be able to handle confrontation

from non-believers? The answer: I won't and neither will you. God is equipping you and me to be able to respond to a (sometimes) hostile person(s) who opposes what we stand for. He wants us to be able to speak the truth in love and not respond out of a desire to get personal justice. How will you and I respond to someone who violently opposes the truth that Jesus is the only way to heaven? There are more controversial topics but that one seems to really hit a nerve with some.

Let's collectively pray for God to equip all of us with this verse: 1 Peter 3:15-16 "But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander."

What Your Atheist Friend Knows About God

Years ago, I stood before Michelangelo's David in Florence, Italy. No one questioned that an artist had sculpted this magnificent piece of Renaissance art. It was the work of a genius. Yet, in the same room, no doubt, there were persons called "atheists" who would deny that a greater Artist was also necessary to create the original David that Michelangelo attempted to imitate. The true David, like other creations of God, was far more difficult to make than what Michelangelo crafted out of stone. That David had functioning eyes that could actually see, instead of an orb of stone.

Underneath the atheist's claim lies a nagging knowledge that a Creator actually made man and all the world of nature around him, with its symmetry, intricacy and beauty. The atheist may suppress that knowledge as a way to make room for his sin, but it is so obvious that only a man seeking to eradicate his moral problem could deny it.

And this is exactly what God tells us: For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, because that which is known about God is evident within them: for God made it evident to them.

For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes, His eternal power



and divine nature, have been clearly seen, being understood through what has been made, so that they are without excuse.

For even though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God or give thanks, but they became futile in their speculations, and their foolish heart was darkened. Professing to be wise, they became fools . . . (Romans 1:18-22)

I have talked with atheists through the years. So far, each one that I can remember has finally admitted to me that he would not believe in God even if there were proof that He existed. This may not be what all atheists could bring themselves to admit, but it is exactly what God states is the case. What can we say then to that honest admission? Most [all?] atheists are moral ones, not intellectual ones.

But there is another fact that atheists believe about God. They believe that they are doing wrong when they sin and they deserve to be punished (Romans


1:32). Again, they may not readily admit this.

Where does this sense of sin come from?

First, it comes from the knowledge of the existence of God, as I already mentioned. But, second, God teaches that they "know the ordinance of God, that those who practice such things [i.e. sins he had just listed] are worthy of death" (Romans 1:32). The phrase, "ordinance of God" is specially used by Paul in Romans to describe what is under the law, those fundamental standards of God rather than the written Law of Moses. This means that without any written Law, their consciences indict them. In other words, they live in an inner world of allegations and defenses, proving that underneath it all, they believe God is there and has a standard by which to live. His actions and thoughts bear this out over and over again. He cannot deny this if he looks closely at his behavior and thoughts.

These two facts leave men and women, atheistic or not, in a frightening position before the God who is actually there. It is wonderful when an atheist will admit these truths honestly and openly. He is on his way to the best of lives and forgiveness of his rebellion against God. It will take more knowledge the knowledge of the gospel itselfalong with true repentance and belief in Christ, before he will have life from God, a life that gives evidence to the authenticity of that faith.

Let's pray that God will open our friend's eyes to see what he or she, in fact, already knows.



The Two Pictures of Christmas

I gaze at two differing pictures of Christmas. The first, a photograph my wife discovered tucked away in an old book, hints of the 1940s. It's Christmas morning, and five smiling children radiate the pleasure of having a few simple gifts arrayed before them, fully satisfied.

Curiously, I recall but one Christmas present of my own childhood. Pulling three cars around the shiny oval, the black engine in that Lionel electric train set sported both headlight and puffing smokestack. And the odd mixture of high-pitched whine tempering the clickety-clacking metal-to-metal crunch of wheel on track thrilled this young lad immensely.

But the engine unexpectedly ground to a halt shortly thereafter. Today I suspect its sudden demise derived from my incessant determination to see how fast I could propel it around curves without jumping the track, as it often did.

Perhaps anticipating my future engineering career, I immediately initiated exploratory disassembly to resolve the malfunction. Finding



nothing, reassembly left several screws and gears without homes. After observing a respectable period of mourning, Mother decisively tossed out the box of useless hardware. My toy brought no more happiness.

Without doubt, the children in the first picture eventually experienced similar disappointments with their toys. Interestingly, the first picture and its gifts actually exist in commemoration of a second picture—one abiding not in my hand, but in my mind—and a gift that never disappoints.

In this other picture, a small knot of men lounge on a grassy slope, gazing into the starry night. Devout in worship, they have often considered—and



assuredly murmured in prayer—those things perceived to bring enduring happiness. Their prayers found unique fulfillment that night.

For one glorious instant, God drew back the veil between two worlds, allowing them to momentarily peer into His eternal inner sanctum. A little while later they gazed in wonder upon the Babe who would eventually become the Man, realizing not that the Man would give even greater gifts than those they had thoughtfully, fervently, carefully articulated in their prayers.

They had long cried out for relief from Roman oppression; the Man would instead release them from the rule of sin in their hearts. They had daily desired food for sheep and families; the Man would instead lead them to green pastures and still waters for their souls.

Our finite minds formulate plans and schemes, and we ask for this and that, positive that having our requests satisfied will assure lasting happiness. But every toy has a way of disappointing, of breaking, of jumping track.

Far better is the gift we neither expect nor deserve, the gift that salves the deep hurts and wide chasms that none but the Man can discern. And the essence of His gift to us—the gift of Himself—lies in a simple phrase He once spoke: "Go your way. Your faith has made you whole."

And in the spirit of this wholeness, both seemingly incongruous pictures of Christmas smoothly reconcile into a single inescapable conclusion: there is but one true Gift and one true Giver—and they are one.



Most of us will never be called to physically lay down our life but we struggle



Bible Trivia Answers · From Pg 13:

- 1. False. The Bible doesn't mention an innkeeper. Luke 2:7 reads, "and she [Mary] gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn."
- 2. False. The Bible is silent about where Jesus was born. No one really knows where Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem.
- 3. False. Although many Christians over the years have held that that Xmas is a disrespectful abbreviation for Christmas, in Greek, X is the first letter of Christos, the word translated, Christ, and was used as an appropriate, honorable abbreviation.
- 4. True. It wasn't until sometime in the fourth century that it was calculated Jesus' birth was on December 25. Modern scholarship suggests that Jesus was really born in April of 5 B.C.
- False. The Bible doesn't mention whether or not Jesus cried, but there is no reason to assume that Jesus was anything other than a typical baby – one who cries.
- 6. False. Matthew 2:11 reads, "On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him." Given the account in Matthew chapter two, regarding the interaction between the wise men and Herod, and Herod's command to kill all of Bethlehem's children under the age of two, Jesus could have been upwards of two-years-old when they found him. It's not quite the romantic tradition we are accustomed to thinking of when we talk and sing about the wise men finding Jesus in the manger.
- 7. True. The "wise men" are called "magi" in the Scripture. Modern scholars suggest that the magi were pagan astrologers. For certain, the magi were not kings. The fact that these pagan astrologers were moved to find the Christ child and to worship Him is one small, but important picture the Scriptures give us that Jesus would be the redeemer sent to all humanity.
- 8. False. A manger was a feeding trough for animals.
- 9. False. Candy canes appeared in the latter part of the 17th century and were plain white until the early 20th century. There is nothing wrong with assigning Christian meaning to the candy cane, but these meanings cannot be found in the candy's factual origins.
- 10. False. The legend of three wise men came into existence based on the fact that the Scriptures name three gifts – gold, frankincense and myrrh – that were presented to the Christ child. The Bible is silent on the actual number of magi.
- 11. False. Massachusetts actually forbid the celebration of Christmas. In 1659, the General Court of Massachusetts enacted a law making any observance of December 25 (other than a church service) a penal offense. People were fined for any related observances or for hanging decorations. This ruling continued until the nineteenth century, when the influx of German and Irish immigrants undermined the Puritan legacy.
- True. The resurrection of Christ overshadow ed the day of His birth in significance for the earliest Christians. The earliest mentions of celebrating Jesus' birth date back to the fourth century.



"CHARLIE BROWN GET'S IT"

Recently, my wife and I visited the Charles M. Schulz museum in Santa Rosa. This is something I have wanted to do for sometime now. I've been a fan of the Peanuts Comic Strip for as long as I can remember, and I have a special affinity with many of the Peanuts characters. I don't know whether Schulz was a man of faith or not but I often sensed a biblical truth interwoven in his humor. Schulz seemed to have a true understanding of the human condition and the ability to express it through the desires and fears of his characters.

Although I have a fondness for all of Schulz's personalities, Linus has become my favorite. Linus, the long suffering little brother of his most domineering and extraordinarily crabby big sister Lucy, somehow manages to be the most cerebral and spiritual of the entire Peanuts gang (barring, of course, his fervent dependence on his blanket and his unfaltering belief in the Great Pumpkin). However, Linus does on occasion, quote directly from scripture and it is not in a mocking fashion as in many comic strips. To me, the most poignant of Linus' biblical quotes is found in the animated TV classic, A Charlie Brown Christmas.

A Charlie Brown Christmas has aired every year since 1965 and has become a traditional must see for families worldwide. The story follows Good Ole' Charlie Brown as he encounters the ever-increasing commercialization of Christmas and how it and secularization has hidden the true meaning of Christmas. After several unsuccessful attempts to find the true meaning of Christmas, Charlie cries out in frustration, "Isn't



there anyone who can tell me what Christmas is all about?" To which Linus replies, "Sure Charlie Brown, I can tell you what Christmas is all about:"

"And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks by night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them and they were terrified. And the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger.'

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men..." Luke 2:8-14.

"And that's what Christmas is all about Charlie Brown."

Wouldn't it be wonderful if we returned our focus to Christ at Christmas? He seems to have been relegated to the shadow of Santa and hidden behind the glittering lights of the tree. How could this have happened when Christ is the true gift giver and the light of the world? How did Christmas become a time of stress and anxiety when it started out as such Good News, Joy and Peace?
