The global community is still reeling from the massive devastation that took place in Japan this past month. It is yet too soon to tell the real damage of the triple tragedy. Thousands of families have had their lives irrevocably changed after the earthquake and tsunami and hundreds of thousands, if not millions, were displaced and without power or water in the aftermath of the destruction. Unfortunately, the horror is not over. In addition to the need to rebuild their homes, towns, and lives, the threat of nuclear radiation is very real and unsettling.

It has been a year since the devastating earthquake in Haiti. After the horrific jolt there left hundreds of thousands dead, those around the world including our nation sprung into action. We did what we could to help. Yet, there is much debate over whether Haiti "had it coming". Some would say that the voodoo hold on the culture led to its demise. Others oppose that thought, but point to the corrupt government. Yet, no one could deny that the impoverished land of Haiti was not built to survive the power of a sizeable earthquake. News shows discussed how Haiti's lack of building codes and shanty-like dwellings were a tragedy waiting to happen.

Japan, however, is a different story. It is said that there is no nation more prepared for an earthquake. Yet, hindsight shows that some things are not in our control. Japan is one of the most industrialized nations on the planet and since they expect earthquakes regularly, they build to accommodate that fact. On March 11, God showed otherwise. The forces of nature proved too much for this industrialized nation. Shifts in the Earth's crust can not be controlled by man, nor can the power of the water driven by tsunami tides.

We, in the west, should sit up and take notice that we cannot control life. We are "but a vapor" the Bible tells us (James 4:14). God is the one who created nature. He created the plates, the oceans, and the tides. It is His creation. He also created life. Each one of those lives that were lost and those grieving survivors are created in His image. Unlike the nature God created, these people are dear to His heart and He loves each one that perished as well as each one that survived.

Many argue at this point saying "Why does He create and then destroy?". "Why does a loving God allow innocent people to suffer or die?" There is no answer comforting enough to the person in the midst of grief. There is no answer that can soothe the anger and dry the tears of the pained mourner. Yet, when the emotions run their course and there is an openness to hear an answer, or for those not directly affected, yet wrestling with doubt and fairness, there is an answer.

God does not kill innocent people, because none of us are, in fact, innocent. God reveals in His Word "We have all fallen short of the Glory of God" (Rom. 3:23). We have all sinned against Him. In fact, we are all born into sin. He has made a way for us, through His own sacrifice of His son. Through that son, Jesus, we are again made right with Him. Not because of our goodness, but because of Jesus life, death, and resurrection.





## Our Purpose by John Imler

Did you ever wonder just why you are on this earth? I know I have. Since surviving a serious heart attack and having a 5-way bypass at the age of 77, while others much younger have passed away, it really weighs on my mind. Friends have sought to encourage me by saying, "God still has work for you to do." But just what is that work? Then, as I studied the Scriptures, several things have been made clear to me.

First, God reinforced my conviction that there is a purpose for all of us, and He has laid it out in advance. Psalms 139:16 states "All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be." Yes, the number of my days was established in God's book, and there is unfinished work already recorded on His pages for me to do.

What is that work is the question? In 2 Cor 1:3-4 Paul gives us a clue with these words: "Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort, who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted by God."

Peter invites us to "Cast all your anxiety (care) on him because he cares for you" (I Peter 1:7). We are invited to do this because it is only as we do so that we receive and experience the comfort that is offered to all of us in all our tribulation. Once we experience that comfort, then we are prepared to comfort those who are in trouble-but not until.

Yes, each of us has experienced our own areas of tribulation—the loss of a loved one, the loss of earthly assets, the loss of a job or career, or the loss of our health—and has asked God "why?" Perhaps his answer is so that we may know the comfort that He alone can give in order that we may be able to comfort those in any trouble by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted by God.

Sharing and comforting each other was an underlying theme in many of the writings of the Apostles to the early church. These are still needed today. In Hebrews 3:13 we are admonished to "encourage one another daily." In Hebrews 10 we are admonished to spur one another on toward love and good deeds, to keep meeting together—and all the more as we see the Day approaching. 1 Thes. 4:18 and 5:11 challenge the believers of the early church to "encourage each other" and to "build each other up." This is Our Purpose.

My mind was on autopilot one Sunday morning as I pulled out of the garage and headed toward church. However, as I rounded the corner and slowed to a stop, something clicked and all systems were activated. There before me was a peach orchard splendidly dressed in radiant pink. I reveled in the beauty and exclaimed audibly, "You did it, God! You control the seasons and promise that spring will follow every winter."

Such an experience may seem foolish to some, but the foundation of my faith rests in the knowledge of a God who does what He says He will do. God's attributes reveal who He is, but we come to trust those attributes by what He does.

On the other hand, says the Lord, "I alone stretched out the heavens. I have swept away your sins like a cloud. I have paid the price to set you free. I do what I say I will do" (from Isaiah 44). Sadly, even though God's superiority is plain for us to see, many still reject Him and follow idols of their own making.

In the New Testament, God's passionate commitment to human redemption and the restoration of relationship with His children is revealed in another mighty deed--the sending of His precious Son, Jesus Christ. We can learn the attributes of Jesus, but we come to trust Him by entering into what He does. As one with His Father, Jesus showed His power over nature, disease, death, and evil forces during His ministry on earth. He was the friend of sinners and prostitutes; He touched the unclean and conquered the stench of death with new life.

In Christ, God performed the most gracious act of all. He granted His Son permission to bear our sins in His own body on the cross. Those of us who ignore God's passionate love are still loved by Him! In living, Christ loved us. In dying, He saved us. When He was buried, our sins were carried far away.

Yet the story goes on! If the substitutionary death of Christ was God's most gracious act, then the resurrection of Christ is the mightiest act, and beyond that, His coming again is a most exciting hope for the future. Because God has shown His trustworthiness in the past by doing what He said He would do, we can count on Him for forgiveness of sin, His presence, strength, and purpose for today, and the assurance of a glorious future forever in His eternal kingdom.

We can know God for who He is, and we can trust Him because of what He does. Let's live victoriously on this solid foundation. Happy Easter!

### Set A Pace And Run The Race By Ronnie McBrayer

My middle school-aged sons have begun serious athletic conditioning in their Physical Education class. Gone are the romping-around-days of freeze-tag and unruly dodge ball games. Now they have to meet physical strength standards and run the mile every week. Now, I'm no help to them. Call on me for help with a history project or a book report. But running? Forget it. If you ever see me running please stop and help me. Something big and bad is chasing me. What with her little collection of 5K trophies and ribbons (continually they mock me), it is their mother who must coach them. And the thing she teaches them most often is how to set pace, how to finish the race they begin.

To complete any long distance race the runner must set a speed that he or she can maintain. Flying out of the starting block as if your britches are on fire will do you no good if you are sucking wind by the second turn; this is true on the track, and true in life. The writer of the book of Hebrews, aptly enough, once compared life to a sporting event. We are athletes on the track in this arena of life and there is a race to run. He says, "Strip down, travel light, and don't quit."

You can't run in stiletto heels, steel-

toed boots, a three-piece suit or denim skirt. Get rid of those things. And forget about carrying anything with you: No backpacks, no coolers or picnic baskets. Free yourself from as much baggage as possible. And then, keep your eyes on the finish line. Don't go wandering into the stands for a hot dog or a beer. Get out of the souvenir shop and quit giving interviews to ESPN while the game is still on. Those who finish the race are the ones who stay at it.

The Scriptures do not provide us with any mystical, steroid-ized shortcuts to "run (or ride) with perseverance the race marked out for us." Instead, they coach us to set a pace for the marathon of life we run. It will take everything we have to finish, but finishing is enough. So take the writer of Hebrews' advice. Get in shape, get light, and get after it. Grind away day after day and mile after mile if you must. You don't have to win the race, just finish.

I have become a fan of one line wisdom. You know those snappy little one-liners that grab your consciousness and cause your head to bobble in agreement... those succinct sayings that pack complexity into a few well-chosen words.

Well I came upon such a line the other day that really set me to thinking (not always a good thing). It read: "If you are in the furnace, it's easy to catch fire." Now on the surface, it makes perfect sense, but my question is, in which context was it written? Was it positive, or negative?

My first take was that it had a negative connotation. For example: It's like a recovering addict returning to the same environment (furnace) that made him an addict in the first place. He has, in effect, placed himself in a position to catch fire again. Or, it's like someone continuingly returning to the fire (furnace) of an abusive relationship, odds are pretty good that they will, once again, get burned. I tend to look at these types of situations not so much as entering a furnace, as it is throwing yourself into an incinerator... the difference being, an incinerator is strictly for destroying things, whereas a furnace can be used in more productive ways.

With this in mind the thought struck me that this one-liner could also have a positive message. For instance, how many times have you heard someone say: "Oh so-in-so is on fire for the Lord." Well that's probably because so-in-so has entered The Lord's Furnace and has caught fire. This is a good thing because God will use so-in-so to fuel his furnace for the good of others. And the really cool thing about The Lord's Furnace is... it is not governed by Einstein's Theory of Relativity, it is ruled by God's relativity to us. This means so-in-so has become fuel for God's furnace, but like the burning bush, he will not be consumed.

In Isaiah 43:2, God tells us: "...When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze."

Now you may be saying, isn't this a contradiction; how can you have one person blazing away and another not getting burned? Well, and this is strictly my opinion, one is ablaze in the spirit, while the other is being purified through the flames of trial and affliction. ## A Peek At My Bookshelf - Recommended Reading by Deena Peterson "Passport Through Darkness" by Kimberly L. Smith


As demands on my time grow, I find myself getting a little pickier about what I read. I'm always on the hunt for books that will move me, change me, make me think, or shake me up. Kimberly L. Smith has done all of that with her book, and I honestly believe it could be one of the most important books you read this year.

"Passport Through Darkness" is by no means easy to read. Some of the events Kimberly describes will leave you shaken to your very core. Some will appall you; some will make you weep; some will leave you burning in anger; some will have you so frustrated you'll yearn to make a difference.

That was what motivated Kimberly. She left her corporate career and comfortable lifestyle for the mission field of Spain, working along with her husband, Martin. What neither of them knew was God had moved them across the globe to a mere jumping off point.

Circumstances led the couple to Portugal, to work side-by-side with a struggling mission effort to impoverished and orphaned children. But what the Smiths uncovered in that orphanage turned my stomach, and sent Kimberly on a mission to stop child-trafficking and to rescue orphans in the darkest parts of the world.

Her mission efforts took her to Sudan and Darfur, areas plagued with disease, genocide, war and atrocities that are mindboggling to many of us. She worked with nothing to rescue those who were society's throw-aways. Often Kimberly's efforts seemed in vain.



Except to the ones she touched in Christ's love and helped out of a world consumed by darkness and evil.

Reading "Passport Through Darkness" will jar you out of your comfortable seat. If you are going through struggles of your own, it will help put those struggles into perspective. And, hopefully, it will motivate all of us to reach out in the name of Jesus to help make a difference.

This isn't just social gospel...this is the real deal. And some of the things Kimberly endured are simple atrocious. And yet she returned, time after time, working tirelessly to help save one child, one mother...one life.

Kimberly is brutally honest about her own personal walk with Christ and her relationship with her husband. When debilitating illness kept him stateside, she



continued to work as a missionary, which strained her relationships at home.

And she was reluctant to share all she had witnessed for fear of what the outcome might be...secrets that nearly cost her all she held dear. This is a book with multiple layers, and a rich reading experience.

My thanks to Audra Jennings at B&B Media for my copy, and to Kimberly for stepping out in faith and writing such a moving book. I'm giving "Passport Through Darkness" the Golden Bookmark for Writing Excellence" and urging everyone to get a copy. This book is published by David C. 

## UNDERWATER WITH YOUR MORTGAGE? What is a Christian Supposed to Do?

Many homeowners, including Christians, are upside down on their mortgage. The world's economy is bleak! Homeowners, including some pastors and churches, have found themselves having to choose between buying groceries and paying bills. No government bailout program can save a drowning homeowner without a job, so don't be duped by scammers, waiting to take your money.

The Obama plan (HR 3648) was designed to help homeowners modify their loans to an affordable amount by adjusting interest rates or reducing loan balance. Unfortunately, only about 5% of applicants are being granted any significant reduction. Most people have been lied to, strung along for months with no answer, told their paperwork was never received, required documents were missing, or they simply didn't qualify for help. Of those that were granted a reduction, 60% of them were back in default within 6 months.

The truth, which is not being told upfront, is that a trial modification immediately puts a homeowner in the path of foreclosure. If denied down the road, the bank will expect the homeowner to "cure" the deficit created by the temporary payment. They will add late charges and attorney fees\*. If the loan can't brought current, including late fees and attorney fees, they are headed for foreclosure and the court house steps.

What is the right thing for a Christian to do?

There are no biblical accounts of mortgage solutions to guide us, no eleventh commandment for instructions, but there are several passages that guide us through debt obligation. Romans 13 makes a pretty clear statement: pay your taxes and all your debts. We are not promised a home on earth, only an eternal home in Heaven and the rest is "dust."

What can Jonah teach us about being "underwater"?

Jonah 1:3-17

Old Jonah was in trouble. So when the crew of the ship determined that he was the cause of the terrible storm, they threw him overboard- no lifeboat, vest, or government bailout. With seaweed wrapped around his neck, Jonah lost all hope. It's hard to imagine the anguish Jonah experienced or the anxiety of swimming in the stomach of a "whale of a fish," full of floating fish heads, guts, seaweed, etc. If ever Jonah prayed, it was probably "fervent" at that point.

When the great fish finally spit Jonah out on land, Jonah had a task to do: preach to Nineveh.

There is a rescue from financial drowning available for you.

Don't run away as Jonah did or stay in deep water when Senate Bill SB 931 went into effect January 1, 2011. It is a lifeline to save your credit, not your home. If after trying for a loan modification, you were denied or strung along for months on end, this new bill mandates that your first loan debt will be forgiven and possibly a second loan. As Christians we should have a clear understanding of sin debt forgiveness, as that debt was paid on the cross. This is about mortgage debt forgiveness, and the banks are now obligated by law to forgive your debt if they agree to a short sale. Help is available. Not a scam to take your money, no upfront fees to guarantee a loan modification, no cost to you at all. Banks can no longer come after the homeowner later for the difference between the loan balance and the sale amount.

Short Sale vs. Foreclosure

Banks are coming to terms with the short sale process and many of them are now telling the borrowers to contact a real estate agent immediately and list their home as a short sale. Owners do not pay real estate commissions, and the banks will eventually stop harassing them once a short sale is initiated.

A short sale allows the bank to recover some of the debt and the homeowner has debt forgiven. One additional benefit for owners with a security clearance: a short sale protects your security clearance, as the closing letter from the bank says "Debt satisfied as agreed."

### Compassion: 10 Ways to Help People in Crisis By Steve Arterburn

1. Be there! Even better than sound advice or financial aid is the physical presence of someone who is genuinely concerned.

2. Listen! It's important that people in crisis are able to verbalize their story. It helps them process the situation – mentally, emotionally, and spiritually. Encourage delaying any non-essential decisions until crisis has passed ... There is one who speaks rashly like the thrusts of a sword, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.~Proverbs 12:18.

3. Don't take any rash statements or harsh words too seriously. People in crisis often vent emotional stress in the most convenient direction. Don't react, respond in love ... Love is patient, love is kind. ~1 Corinthians 13:4

4. Know when to back off! Often, well-intentioned expressions of concern can cross emotional and practical boundaries. Watch for subtle signals that it may be time to give the person in crisis some space ... The plans of the heart belong to man, But the answer of the tongue is from the Lord. ~Proverbs 16:1

5. Pray and alert others to pray too! In addition to the supernatural power of prayer, people in crisis often find great comfort in knowing that they're being prayed for ... pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much. ~James 5:16

6. Find practical ways, however small, to help the person in crisis maintain routine functions. Simple things like bringing meals, doing laundry, taking the kids to soccer practice, etc. relieve enormous pressure during difficult times ... And do not neglect doing good and sharing; for with such sacrifices God is

#### pleased. ~Hebrews 13:16

7. Help the person in crisis maintain a realistic perspective. People in crisis are often overwhelmed by their situation. Remind them of life's truly important issues and help them weigh their situation in the light of a realistic, eternal perspective.

8. Link them with helpful resources. People in crisis often don't think clearly. Be an objective third party who can point to crisis agencies, clergy or other assistance.

9. Don't think you're not needed just because the crisis has passed. Crisis situations often have long-term consequences. Make yourself available for continuing care and concern.

10. What would Jesus do? Jesus encountered people in crisis regularly. Examine Scripture to glean wisdom from His example.

### If It Feels Good For Me, Isn't It Right? Faithfacts.org

Feelings are not reliable. They can change. They can be dangerous. For example, the feeling of anger produces numerous ills, including murder.

As explained by Herman J. Eckelmann (Montgomery book in the resource list), people have felt good about "bad" systems as well as "good" ones. Nazism, communism, and the cult of Jim Jones all began with good feelings.

These examples show that the notion that truth is relative to the cultural setting or situation is a cop-out. While there may some differences at the margin from culture to culture, every culture has essentially the same set of moral absolutes. For example—trustworthiness, loyalty, honor, self-sacrifice, etc. are common to all cultures. And when a culture violates moral absolutes, we rightfully condemn such activity. What "is" is not equivalent to "what ought to be." Ritual human sacrifice is never right no matter what the culture. The difference between Adolph Hitler and


Utilitarianism or majority rule are likewise inadequate standards for truth. Slavery in America was not right just because it was normal or useful. There is transcendent moral truth.

We do not speak of morals in animals—only in man. This enlightens us to the biblical teaching that man is "made in the image of God." As put by R. C. Sproul, "man's role as image bearer of God carries with it an awesome moral responsibility that cannot be neutralized by a relative standard of goodness."

Being a Christian does not make us perfect. But history suggests that by removing the restraints of God's law and love, the worst barbarism breaks forth. There were several massive efforts to control or forbid religion in the twentieth century-Soviet Russia, Communist China, the Khmer Rouge, and Nazi Germany. The result was not more peace and harmony but more oppression. As Alister McGrath said in his history of atheism, "The 20th century gave rise to one of the greatest and most distressing paradoxes of human history: that the greatest intolerance and violence of that century were practiced by those who believed that religion caused intolerance and violence."

Which philosophy produces love: every man for himself or Christian compassion?

Sinful man tends to give preference to models that rationalize his lawlessness and desire for absolute self-sovereignty (what feels right), rather than on the basis of a transcendent moral order that enables the human soul. The goal is truth, not excuse.

He was surprised at just how much he was able to put into the box (12"X12"X6") and how little it cost (\$12.95) to ship. As he walked out of the post office the Holy Spirit prompted him that if he could send all of this for one soldier why couldn't his church do the same thing on a larger scale. Maybe his church, he thought, could "Adopt a Platoon" of about 20 men. He began to think "out of the box" (no pun intended) and realized that if other local churches would come on board, our community could show the love of Jesus Christ in a very tangible way. In fact, in addition to snacks and hygiene items, we could include Christian videos, messages, or cards to encourage our troops and let them know we're praying for them as well. What really struck Tony was how simple and inexpensive this would be.

Word of Life Church did, in fact, adopt a platoon. Platoon A, 591 ST ENCO, Camp Taji, Iraq, to be precise.

After talking with Tony and hearing his "heart", it is clear that God has given him his "mission". He wants to bless the young men and women who are sacrificing for all of us and hopefully have an eternal impact on some of their lives. He prays for that scared or lonely soldier who reaches out in email or letter and be open to embrace the truth of the gospel and receive eternal life through our Savior.

So how can we in the Yuba-Sutter area (a small location many thousands of miles away) make a difference. Tony believes that if our local churches are willing to make small commitment to place a box in a common area for people to place inexpensive items and then send them to a troop, platoon or company once a month, blessings would flow across the globe!

## **View From The Pulpit**


Is The Lord Jesus Christ Open-minded? By Pastor Michael A. Carling - Free Grace Baptist Church

We are told today by certain religious leaders that we need to have an "open-mind" when it comes to religion. Too many of us are apparently "biased," or "not willing to listen to the ideas of others" when it comes to God and the way of salvation.

The Apostle Peter would be considered by ecumenicists today as "narrow-minded," "intolerant," and even prejudiced toward only one way of salvation which comes through only one Savior. When questioned by the religious leaders of Jerusalem by what power or by what name an impotent man had been healed, Peter responded that

the man had been healed through the power of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom they had crucified. Peter also added that "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved" (Acts 4:12). This was a rather bold statement by Peter. Was Peter asserting that Judaism was not the religion through which faith and salvation is granted to a sinner? Did his statement also mean that salvation did not come through any other "god" or savior raised up from among men?

What did Jesus Christ, the Son of God, teach concerning these things? Christ said, "I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst" (John 6:35). The words "I am" in the original language of the Greek New Testament are an emphatic "I myself am and no one else." Christ alone and no one else is the bread of life. To never hunger or thirst spiritually means coming to Christ alone.

Christ said, "All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out" (John 6:37). The "all" that God chose in Christ before the foundation of the world will, by God's grace, come to Christ and He will in no wise cast them out.

Christ said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me" (John 14:6). The same Greek words used for "I am," as noted before, are used here also. Christ said I and no one else am THE way, THE truth, and THE life. There is no other way, no other truth, no other life. If anyone wants to come to God the Father, he can not come except by or through the Lord Jesus Christ.

Did the Lord Jesus Christ teach that salvation was possible by any other savior? The answer is no. Did He teach that there are many religious "ways" that lead to the same God? Again, the answer is no. Is there any other name under heaven given among men, other than the Lord Jesus Christ, whereby we must be saved? Once more, the answer is no.


The Lord Jesus Christ taught one religion, one way, one truth, one life, one savior. He was sent by God the Father to purchase redemption for a particular people, whom God chose in Christ before the foundation of the world. If you believe that "Christ alone" is the sinner's only hope, then you too will be considered "biased," "prejudiced," and not "openminded." Let God be true but every man a liar, for God the Son said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me."

### Shamed Into Action - America and Libya by Chuck Colson

"Who is my neighbor?" That's what an expert in the Law asked Jesus after the Lord affirmed the two great commandments: Love God with all your heart, mind and strength, and love your neighbor as yourself. Jesus answered with the parable of the Good Samaritan. You know the story and the punch line. The Samaritan saw his neighbor in the man beaten and left for dead along the road to Jericho, and the Samaritan loved his neighbor by tending to his wounds.

In a world awash in crises, no nation on earth has the power or resources to stop every injustice and tend to every wound. But there are times when a great nation can and must do something. And for the past several weeks, forces loyal to the brutal dictator Muammar Qaddafi bombed and strafed innocent civilians along with the rebel forces they had targeted. And the U.S. did nothing.

The magnitude of our inaction hit home to me late last week. I bumped into the great Catholic theologian Michael Novak. He reminded me that once Michelle Obama had said that when her husband won the nomination for President, it was the first time in her life she'd been proud of her country. Then

Novak told me that he had never been so ashamed of his country as when our leaders failed to lift a finger to stop the massacre in Libya. Strong, sobering words.

And now the U.S. has been shamed into action by, of all things, the United Nations, which declared a no-fly zone over Libya, and the government of Libya then announcing a cease-fire. But for American honor and credibility among the oppressed people of the world the damage has been done. We dawdled too long -- just has we did with the genocide in Rwanda.

Now don't get me wrong. Putting troops in harm's way is the most difficult decision a President can make, especially at a time when our military is stretched so thin. I know. I was there myself in the White House. It's tough. But as I've said many times on BreakPoint, a President must first weigh whether military action is just. According to the Christian just war tradition, in order to be just, a military action must be for a just cause and done for the right reason; it must be waged by a legitimate authority as a last resort; the action must be proportional to the threat; and there has to be a probability of success. I can't imagine a more just and
